Citywide festival running throughout June to celebrate architecture in the city and those that inhibit it

Working with LLDC to curate a series of events in and around the Olympic Park area

Want everyone to have a space and voice to get involved – you don't have to be an architect to participate

The whole point of the festival is to challenge architecture to make it more inclusive

Working on developing a programme of events, talks tours etc.

Want to help connect people and bring them together to collaborate on ideas for the festival Will be extending submissions until 25th March

<u>S. Roberts:</u> There is an online form for events submissions

Aware that dates and times will most likely be tbc but as long as you have a solid concept for an idea

If you are a venue wanting to offer your space for an event then get in contact with LFA direct to discuss the capability of your space

Over the next few weeks we will be going through submissions and begin to programme the events

Had a meeting last July with CIG stakeholders to discuss what is and isn't working currently and how we can improve

The 7 pillars of the CIG are the same as the pillars of the newspaper

Been working on appointing vice chair roles for each pillar

Stress the importance of the digital directory Tom mentioned earlier in order to aid sourcing local supply chains and working with the circular economy

- The HWCRAIC report showed that there is a real need for a digital directory in HWFI to keep people informed

Want to make sure that we hold people accountable for what they say at CIG meetings

- Stour Trust / Southern Grove is a great example of this happening

Have also been working with Compost on a series of 4 workshops looking into the inner working of the CIG from a small grant we won

Our first ever impact report will be published by the end of this month

Have been working on updating the CIGs terms of reference and code of conduct

- the clay is still wet and these are up for debate and further discussion

Immediate priorities for the CIG:

- Develop a sustainable blended finance model
- Work on setting up a creative directory

W. Chamberlain: Yes. Our last application to FFL for a large grant was unsuccessful ever after they told us how much of a good idea the CIG was and how much it is needed in the community. We need to start generating revenue for it ASAP so we can continue to develop it
