## **Richard Priestly (Cell Studios)**

Cell was in the original building of Stone Studios

- When Stone Studios development began, a number of artists were rehoused directly across the road
   The aim is that the artists that want to will get the chance
   to move back to the original site in purpose-built
   workspaces, and paying less rent than they were before
  - Because of the way the Section 106 agreement is worded and the intent of the Creative Land Trust, artists can reside there for the rest of their days
  - Helps to keep the creative community here and not push them out

Getting school students into artist studios to see and understand what is going on and get an insight into the working practice

Having artists host visits in their studios that we will manage
