Agenda

1. Hackney Wick Boulder Project (Jack Griffiths)

- The Boulder Project is a new bouldering centre that has just opened in old the Shapes building at 117 Wallis Road. The directors Jack and Tom already run a successful climbing centre in Bristol and the idea for setting-up a space in the Hackney Wick area started in Summer 2016 – climbing walls are a great alternative to bars – bring people together and promoting being active etc. Josh is the centre manager and available to help with any enquiries.
- They have a 2 year contract in the old Shapes building (now managed by arbeit), so have built a pop-up climbing wall. There are already people coming from outside Hackney Wick to visit the centre. Keen to create links with local companies - free introduction sessions and incentives for locals.
- Looking to set up a word class climbing facility, very ambitious and their [online promo video has had 50k views already](#).
- Boulder social events on Tuesday and Thursdays, climbing friends available to answer any questions and give advice. Café is open to the public, uses local companies – e.g. the coffee roasters in Queens Yard, Stour Space cakes etc.

2. Hackney Quest (Luke Billingham)

- Hackney Quest is a youth and community charity that has been working in the area for 29 years. The group has been commissioned by the Wick Award to run a youth voice project to identify the biggest problems for young people in the area, work on solutions and give young people a voice.
- There 4 main strands to the programme:
 1. Research - will spend time speaking to young people about their views, so good to know where young people like to hang out in the area.
 2. Events – will hold events to raise the awareness of what's going on in Hackney Wick. Asking people to come forward to showcase their activity / business / groups.
 3. Youth Panel – will form a group of 6-10 young people, diverse and representative. The panel will look at research in depth and identify priorities for the area.
 4. Fund – there is a fund available for projects that will meet the priorities for the area and make a difference to lives of young people.
- Nick Sharman noted that the Wick Award are very glad to have Hackney Quest on board and need to make a link between the great enterprising in the area and local young people.
- Upstarter and Plot offering support for projects with internships / experience etc.

3. Studio Wayne McGregor (Kate McCurdy)

- The dance company have a new studio space being built within Here East, have been in a temporary space.
- Will be working in collaboration across dance, theatre, film performance, music videos projects. Keen interests in science and technology.
- Will run a development programme with London artists which gives studio space and support in return for education workshops.
- The studio won't be open to the public on a day-to-day basis however looking for partnerships with local community groups and artists to bring the public into the space.

4. Plexal (Keith Bates)

- Based in the Technology Innovation Centre at Here East, Plexal have taken 68,000 sq ft of space. They are in-between a start-up co-working space and business accelerator, will be focussed around all types of technology including augmented reality, data analytics, fashion tech.
- There will be a mentoring programme and corporate innovation support.
- Currently in a pop-up space with 12 companies. Working with a team of 9 and will be expanding rapidly over the next 6 months so will be very busy. Permanent space due to open fully in June.
