Save Hackney Wick – questions for Lance Forman.

- 1. Why does Forman need to get hold of a small corner of the Vittoria Wharf site, when he previously owned a large amount of land south of his factory, which he bought to build the "Olympics Riviera"? The land was sold to London and Quadrant for £21 million in 2015. Forman appears to have owned about 75% of it. (land registry document attached)
- 2. Forman made an Option agreement with the LLDC (OPLC) in 2012 for the Vittoria Wharf triangle. The land would be optioned to him, once Vittoria Wharf was demolished. How much influence has this agreement had on the LLDC, in their decision to build the footbridge?

- 3. What is part (b) of the Call Option period, which the LLDC redacted on the document? It's on page 2 of the document.
 - Responses from Lance Forman: Formans see themselves as a small, artisan, local business. They have been in the local area for over 113 years and are the oldest producer of smoked salmon in the world. They are committed to the local community and to supporting local artists. The Smokehouse Gallery has been running since 2010.
 - Vittoria Wharf residents have always known that they had a short term tenancy and that the building would be part-demolished to build a bridge.
 They have had their fair share of difficulties with LLDC and with building and land being sold and then bought from them (to make way for the Olympic site).
 In terms of the bridge, it was always the intention for it to be built and then Formans would be given an option to buy land the other side to make up for the land they lost in the building of the bridge.

As a business their delivery vans need to get in and out of Fish Island easily. They have put forward a proposal that the road bridge remains only available for residents of fish island, to try and minimise the impact to the local area.

NB: Sir William Atkinson aired his thanks to Lance for making such a clear and plausible answer. He said he would like it noted that his answer sounded reasonable and fair and that he appreciated the context to the issue – others agreed

- There was another question to Lance about protecting the future of other buildings from development plans.
 - Lance response is that this is an issue to take this up with planners for the area as this is beyond the scope of local business owners to be able to effect.
- Hackney Council Representative: the master-planning document that is going forward includes a commitment to affordable workspace (£8/m²) for the local area

Action: will add affordable work space discussion with Hackney/ LLDC onto the agenda

Remi Landaz – what is the provision for affordable workspace in the new developments?

Lorna Blake – Telford Homes are committed to delivering 3,023sqm of affordable workspace
