All leases have a 3 month notice period
They want businesses in Queen's Yard that are
more 'exciting and vibrant'
Rent has gone up significantly

<u>S. Wall:</u> What is already in Queen's Yard is what people want, I get my car serviced at the garage there

If there is an opportunity to give feedback on this, would definitely be interested (echoed by many others in the meeting)

N. Williams: Might be worth getting an email together to send to them?

S. Solanki: You would need to organise a publicfacing campaign against Pearl & Coutts very quickly - happy to support in any way Would be a joke if they removed everyone in Queen's Yard because you are not organised

<u>W. Chamberlain:</u> What is the relationship with Pearl & Coutts like from The Yard's perspective?

K. E. Ewer: Yard had a site they were developing on and it might not be possible anymore because of what is happening. Now trying to find out where and what a new lease would look like. Not on the same track anymore and it has been tough trying to work things out. Will join in on group conversations.

Arbeit are also moving out, unsure why

W. Chamberlain: It is important for Pearl & Coutts to know how important it is to support the existing business community in Queen's Yard. The LLDC is supportive of The Yard, is there an opportunity to help here?

J. Holland: Can have a conversation about it. Queen's Yard is outside of the LLDC area, so unsure how much influence they can have S. Cole: How many times do we have to hear this? Any landlords at the meetings? No, of course not. Rinsing the area, accountable to no one. And this area is a model for the cutting edge of the creative economy. Canal Park and bridge:

<u>P. Tudor:</u> Planting will begin on canal park soon Completing handrail work on the bridge, will open to busses next year

Growing Concerns:

S. Wall: Working and volunteering at community gardens garden centre along the canal Clarion Housing have closed the centre and are closing access to the garden space Looking for help/ideas to help keep it open as a community space

There is no solid plan just yet, it is just seeing what interest there is within the community

HW Underground:

N: McDonald: As some of you will have heard, HW Underground will be closing by the end of September, most of the people and businesses will be relocating to The Baths which is happening over the next two weeks. We'll be maintaining everyone's jobs! This has always been the plan and though heartbreaking in many ways it's also a super exciting time. We are very proud of what we have achieved there over less than 2 years with no public funding as a means of setting examples of community empowerment and the commons as a tool for social change. Rehoming over 20 at risk creative businesses to create 24 FTE jobs plus paying

N. McDonald: Doh is likely to close but all staff will be kept on and transferred to the existing cafe at the Baths
