	Introduction - Juliet Can, local resident in Fish Island since 2007. Born in Stratford. Used to be a director of Stour Space. Now running the Stour Trust which is not connected to the other Stour businesses. First time chairing the CIG since maternity leave. Welcome Juliet!		
1	CDT Update - Paul Reynolds		
	Continuing discussions with property developers around securing some long term space. As reported at the last CIG, Anderson Group have made us an an exciting offer on an opportunity at Swan Wharf. First space we'll be getting is a year-long lease on a shop unit here at the Trampery Fish Island Village. By next month we will havehopefully signed a lease. That will be for a youth activated fashion project. There is also the circular economy hub project with UCL just to south of the Aquatic Centre -design work progressing, due to hopefully go into planning this month Ongoing discussions, we'll do a presentation next month. Been a commission on a public realm study -joint piece of work between Hackney Council and CDT and architecture practice called muf. They will be presenting at the next CIG meeting to cover the background. There isn't funding to deliver anything at the moment, it's more looking at the area to identify issues e.g. flood relief.	J. Can: Challenge previously was getting access to input from artists who live in the warehouse. How are you going to deal with this? P. Reynolds: We're looking at how we can best maximise the number of voices included. We've got contacts, groups like this, resident's town hall. We'll be looking at how we can go out to people rather than expecting them to come to us. W. Chamberlain: Is it worth talking about the station underpass as well? Hackney Council, LLDC, and Network Rail have launched a competition to paint the underpass 30mx3m. There is no budget to pay artists for their time - only materials are covered. No one should work for free so we aren't promoting the competition. Would be interesting to hear views of the room. P. Reynolds: We're not actively involved in this. It's a separate piece of work. It's disappointing that these types of competitions exist where people are expected to work for exposure. Been some discussion on HW Facebook groups. Would be good to talk to Network Rail about making it something more long-term. We'll see what we can do. W. Chamberlain: Network Rail was invited to attend today but no one replied. Leona Roche: We understand the concerns. The competition came from requests from community groups for a space to paint in the area. But	

understand the issues and concerns and we'll continue to raise them.

C. Smyth LLDC: Nothing to add.

W. Chamberlain: Community groups had approached Network Rail asking if they could get involved and Creative Wick was one of them. We commissioned John Atherton and Busk for the mural on the East bound platform. I've been in touch with NR since October about this opportunity. It's disappointing to go ahead and launch the competition without consultation given we were in conversation already. I'd be happy to pick that up with you and pass it on if that would help.

Leona: That would be great.

2 Stour Studios - Michael Trew

Michael Trew is an artist who held a studio at Stour Space for many years before moving to a new studio building in Haggerston operated by Stour Studios Ltd.

A. Scrivens: What is it that you want for the future?

M. Trew: I want people to know what happened so that they can make informed decisions. I didn't know about 2019. There's a narrative of not speaking out and I am not happy with that.

Rachel: You want vulnerable people who can't afford studios to not be lured into a false sense of community.

<u>Paul Charters</u>: Are police involved in a criminal investigation? What's happening with the Stratford Site?

M. Trew: I've reported this to missing persons. Lots of people have done fraud reports. I've spent time with the police. Many people have reported it to their banks. Nothing actively happening any more. I've also reported it to Companies House. I'm not involved in the business at Stratford. I've heard no communication from Neil. Apparently things are happening there but I can't get involved. A. Scrivens: Have you sought any legal advice from anybody?

M. Trew: investigation would be the best way but

the business insolvency route didn't work.

J. Norman: Notify GLL as well. I could send you the contact.

3 Hackney Arts - Jodie Norman

Wick First is now known as Hackney Arts. We're delivering the three LLDC sites adjacent to the HW station. 190 homes, mixture of private sale, affordable rent and shared ownership. Plus non-residential space including a community-led incubator hub. 4000sqm of new public realm space.

We've officially partnered with Bow Arts Trust to deliver commercial strategy. We've been working across a number of community projects.

BA Trust are an arts charity providing affordable space since 1994. It will have a generational impact.

Some of the space will be closer to market rate. We are starting onsite in May. Carrying out enabling works from May until November. From November, main contractor will start.

Completion of development will be in phases.

September 2025 is proposed completion.

Community can get involved with hoarding project. Commissions for local artists. There are other art projects too. One permanent piece will be installed. We'll be putting together a plan for that and share that with everyone.

There'll be a newsletter as well with updates.

Jodie is leaving soon.

W. Chamberlain: Are you thinking of having a free community painting wall in the development?

J. Norman: It would be exciting to build that into the scheme. We'll try to commission a bespoke piece initially. Bow Arts will be heavily involved in managing commercial space as well as the public realm. Anything following that we'd like it to be organic.

5	Stage Left Studios - Tom Sankey	
	Opened a drama studio for young people and children. Started by offering sensory classes for 2-3 year olds and performance classes for 4-6 year olds. We have programmes for up to 12 year olds. https://www.stageleftstudios.co.uk/	J. Can: What is the capacity? How much does it cost? T. Sankey: Our classes for 2-3 year olds are for 9 children. If there's more interest capacity can be whatever is needed. Dream is to take the whole venue over on a Sunday. 4-6 year olds are a class of 18 with a teaching ratio of 1 to 8. Introductory offer is £39 a month via direct debit. 41 sessions throughout the year. 4 week membership is £54. J. Can: what's your government structure? There are a few opportunities for grant funding which would make you more accessible for low income communities. T. Sankey: That would be the dream. The venue we work in has two spaces on ground floor which are accessible. Plan is to build it up to offer early morning classes to people from low income families. At the moment can't do it financially. Grant funding isn't really offered. W. Chamberlain: Are you talking to the Yard Theatre? They have an established programme for local children T. Sankey: That would be great.
7	Social Impact Investment - Danny Wilson	
	Primary function is to invest in charities. Focus to provide affordable and ethical financial support to people working round the park. All interest is recycled back in. 75% of organisations we've funded have been charities.	J. Can: application process can be complex and inaccessible. Perhaps that's an area some partners can offer support with? D. Wilson: some organisations can send someone along to help with the process but that isn't always the case.

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If you've got a good project and want to buy an asset like a van and you can demonstrate you can pay it back then give us a shout. We can only lend to companies, CIC or charities.

Cost of living crisis: if you have a project which helps people with this, there's grant funding available. I can share more information and will put this all in an email.

<u>J. Can:</u> as a recipient of a loan, is there scope for us to see how the interest repayments we've made have benefited others?

D. Wilson: Definitely.

9 Caramel Rock - Travis Goodchild

We have general courses for level 1 & 2 in fashion, art and design. We'll be running level 3 soon. These courses are based in Newham but are accessible for all. We want to connect with as many people as people.

We are also running an alternative provision programme which is for young people from 14 years old.

We are also running a project promoting healthy living and lifestyle and blending it with fashion.

Starting some mentoring with industry professionals. We're looking to enhance our school programme for young people after school..
